Municipalities with a regulated separate storm sewer system (permittees) must develop and implement an operations and maintenance program that includes a training component and has the goal of preventing or reducing pollutant runoff from municipal operations (Minimum Control Measure 6 (MCM 6)). In this workshop, we will review the three Best Management Practices (BMPs) associated with MCM 6 and will apply the topics covered in the workshop to interactive exercises. Topics will include identification and documentation of municipal facilities and activities that have the potential to generate runoff, development of an Operations & Maintenance Plan, pollution prevention & education, annual training programs, and Best Management Practices (BMPs). MCMs 4 and 5: Construction Site Stormwater Runoff Control and Post-Construction Stormwater Management (PCSM) for New Development and Redevelopment

Under Chapter 102, Erosion and Sediment (E&S) Control, County Conservation Districts and/or DEP must issue a permit for earth disturbance activities greater than or equal to 1 acre. This workshop will focus on Minimum Control Measures (MCMs) 4 & 5 – Construction Site Runoff Control and Post-Construction Runoff Control. The goal of the Construction Site Runoff Control MCM is to protect our waterways from stormwater-related pollution that can result from construction activities. The goal of the Post-Construction Runoff Control MCM is to avoid increased stormwater runoff problems and increased non-point source pollution that often accompanies the development of land and associated increase in impervious surfaces. We will discuss the requirements of both of these MCMs during the workshop. Presentation given by Buchart Horn, Inc.
