Region 3 Water Technical Assistance (WaterTA) Program


The <u>Region 3 Water Technical Assistance (WaterTA) program</u> offers direct support to municipalities, tribes, and water utilities in the Mid-Atlantic region, to help them access federal and state funding to address water infrastructure needs. Coordinated by the University of Maryland Environmental Finance Center through a five-year award from the US Environmental Protection Agency, the program aims to increase the number of communities that can successfully access water infrastructure funding to ensure safe, reliable water systems for all.

Eligible Communities

Assistance is available to any municipality, tribe, and water system in US EPA Region 3, which covers Delaware, the District of Columbia, Maryland, Pennsylvania, Virginia, and West Virginia. Assistance is provided at no cost to communities and is delivered on the basis of availability and need. Priority is given to historically underserved and disadvantaged communities and those that meet their state's affordability criteria.

Available Services

Assistance is available at any step in the process of accessing water infrastructure fundina. including identifving water challenges; developing plans: building technical, financial, and managerial capacity; and completing funding application materials. Projects can span drinking water, wastewater, stormwater, source water protection, nonpoint source, decentralized wastewater (e.g., septic systems). and/or Financial Capability Assessment (FCA) assistance.
